#### Appropriate engineering controls

Provide adequate general and local exhaust ventilation.

#### Eye/face protection

If a risk assessment indicates eye contact is possible, suitable eye protection should be worn e.g. safety spectacles, safety goggles or a faceshield as appropriate. Personal protective equipment for eye and face protection should comply with European Standard EN166.

#### Hand protection

Glove thickness is not necessarily a good measure of glove resistance as the permeation rate will depend on the exact glove composition. The breakthrough time for any glove material may be different for different glove manufacturers. Considering the data specified by the glove manufacturer, check during use that the gloves are retaining their protective properties and change them as soon as any deterioration is detected.
