

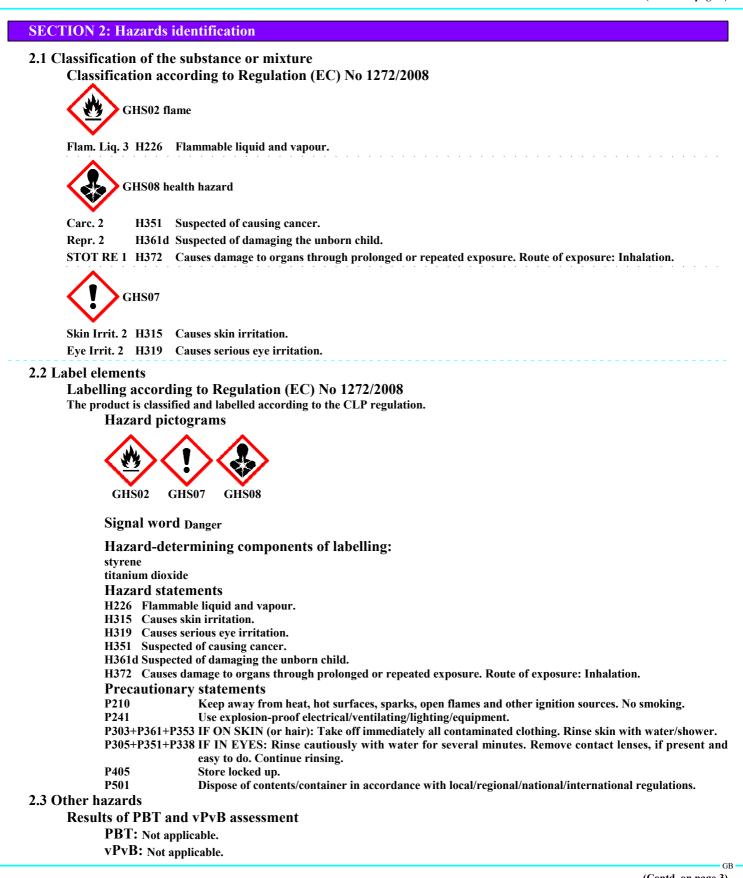

#### 4.1 Description of first aid measures

#### **General information:**
